

Making a difference

It is wonderful to witness the ways in which goodhearted, compassionate people seek ways to support each other, especially those who really do struggle. It would be about isolating myself out of fear or a sense of powerlessness. Is the vision of my life merely about ME, or can it be transformed to be about WE? Is God at the centre of

From ashes to glory

In Lent, we spiritually enter the forty days' desert experience of Jesus. As Jesus was led into the desert by God's Spirit, we willingly enter the season, praying that we will become more open to what God desires to reveal to us during this time of retreat, reflection and preparation for mission.

We may find pathways forward to allow the Easter hope of the Resurrection to give deeper meaning to our lives and to the lives of those we meet. The forty days of Jesus mirrors the forty vears of the Hebrew tribes who centuries earlier were led from slavery in Egypt to a new life that God would reveal to them. As God liberated them, so today God desires to set us free so that we humans can develop hearts of flesh. souls that care, spirits that rise from the ashes like the phoenix. The season of Lent is a journey from ashes to Resurrection glory.




